

Students' Feedback Analysis, May 2019

For the Semester, the examinations of which were held in May 2019, total responses received were 1680. The first question, *'Did you learn the course/paper according to the objective it specified'* received 1533 'Yes' responses out of a total of 1680 responses, which makes it 91.25 percent; and 147 'No' responses which makes it 8.75 percent. This makes the objectives set by the University for all its courses and the learning that took place thereof, again were clearly in agreement.

The second question, *'Do you feel the course/paper will be of any help to you in your career progression (for example, employment or higher studies)?'* received 1619 'Yes' responses out of a total of 1680 responses, which makes it 96.36 percent; and 61 'No' responses which makes it 3.63 percent. This makes the courses and their relevance in terms of employability, market needs and higher studies are super effective and up to date.

The third question, *'Have you had easy access to the course material (for example in the University Library or in market)?'* received 1328 'Yes' responses out of a total of 1680 responses, which makes it 79.04 percent; and 352 'No' responses which makes it 20.95 percent. Though positive responses appear very good, the fact that almost 21 percent responses came negative suggests that this area still requires improvement.

The fourth question, *'How do you evaluate the teacher who taught you the course?, received the responses as follows:*

Excellent: 1015

Good: 430

Average: 148

Poor: 87

Total: 1680

From the figures above it is obvious that from the teachers who taught courses, 60.41 percent received 'excellent' assessment/grade; 25.59 percent received 'good' as grade; 8.80 percent received 'average' grade, and 5.17 percent received 'poor' grade.

The fifth question *'Any other comment that you wish to make about your course or teacher or learning resources etc.'* is an open-ended question, wherein the students are provided freedom to make any comments with respect to course, teacher and learning. All the teachers have been given access to the comments made on the courses that they taught.

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
