# 1. About the University

Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) is a Central University, established by an Act of Parliament with all India jurisdiction in 1998. The headquarters and main campus of MANUU is in Gachibowli, Hyderabad. It is spread over 200 acres. MANUU is recognized as a major higher education service provider across the remote areas of the country for marginalized and first generation learners of Urdu medium through its regular and distance mode programs. MANUU commenced with distance education programs in 1998 and consolidated its academic and research base in Urdu medium regular programs in 2004. The University is named after Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first Minister of Education of Independent India, a scholar par excellence, a prolific writer, an inimitable orator, a gallant freedom fighter, a visionary of the post independent Indian education system and an architect of technical and scientific education in Independent India.

Presently, MANUU is in the process of consolidating the existing institutions, while expanding it to reach the unreached through various intervention measures. Further, to meet the rising aspirations of its youth in general and Urdu speaking community in specific, the University is making considerable progress in all fronts of academics, research and governance with specific vision, mission and objectives.

### Vision

To provide access to quality education through Urdu as medium of instruction, while adhering to the inclusive policy.

### Mission

# 5. Printed and Digital Study Material

After the completion of the admission process, University provides study material (which is called Self Instructional Material (SLM) to the students. # **5.1 Audio-Visual Programmes**

A large repository of audio-visual educational programmes has already been prepared by the Instructional Media Centre (IMC) at MANUU and new lessons are regularly produced and uploaded. Students and LSCs can access the audio-visual resources of IMC at (<a href="https://www.imcmanuu.com">https://www.imcmanuu.com</a>). Furthermore, the students can also access the video lessons which are available on the university's YouTube Channel prepared by the Instructional Media Center, MANUU at (<a href="http://youtube.com/imcmanuu">http://youtube.com/imcmanuu</a>). The audio-visuals of the Islamic Studies programme are also available on the university's website.

### 5.2 Evaluation

The scheme of the evaluation is given in the Prospectus of the current year. The maximum marks are (100) in each paper. (70) marks are for the term-end examination and (30) marks for the assignments. The total number of assignments to be submitted and the deadlines for submission are given in the Prospectus of the current year. A candidate must score a minimum of (12) marks in each assignment and a minimum of (28) marks in each paper in the term-end examination to be declared pass in that paper.

## 5.3 Assignments

Assignments are an integral part of the evaluation. The assignments help the students to practice for the term-end examination and improve their writing skills. The continuous assessment ensures that the learners read the study material provided to them. Assignments must be handwritten in the candidates own hand writing and submitted at the Lerner Support Centre (Study Centre) before the last date of submission. From the Academic Year 2021-22, a system of online assignments has been introduced by the university by which the students can complete and submit the assignments online.

## 5.4 Instructions for Assignments

The detailed instructions for preparing and submission of assignments will be provided to the learners along with the assignment question paper each semester. Students must read and follow the instructions.

# 5.5 Guidelines for Submission of Assignments

The students must submit the assignments at the Lerner Support Centre (Study Centre) in which they are enrolled in. Students need not send the assignments to the DDE or University

headquarters or the Regional Centre. Acknowledgement of receipt of the assignments must be obtained from the Lerner Support Centre (Study Centre) and the same must be retained by the student till the declaration of pass in the examination. From the Academic Year 2021-22 the University has commenced the system of online assignments.

### 5.6 Term-end examination

The term-end examination is held as per the schedule given in the Prospectus of the current year. The learner will have to pass in all the papers before the completion of the maximum duration of the programme. A student may move on to the next semester without passing in the current semester, with backlogs or without appearing in the examination. However, payment of fee for the following session is essential for follow-on admission.

### 5.7 Guidelines for term-end examination

The candidates are advised to follow the examination guidelines available on the university website (<a href="www.manuu.edu.in">www.manuu.edu.in</a>). Hall-ticket and the university student identity card must be in the possession of the learner to gain entry into the examination hall. Students must sign in the D-form and enter their respective answer book number.

# 7. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

# ➤ Is MANUU M.A. Islamic Studies Programme Approved by Regulatory Bodies?

Yes, M.A Islamic Studies programme is approved by the University Grants Commission and Distance Education Bureau which are higher regulatory bodies of the country.

**▶** What is the Eligibility for Distance M.A. Islamic Studies in MANUU?

The candidate must hold a bachelor's degree or equivalent degree in any discipline from a recognised university/ institution.

- ➤ Is there any age limit for admission in distance mode Islamic Studies programme?

  No, there is no age limit.
- > What is the Course Duration for MANUU Distance M.A. Islamic Studies?

The duration of completing MANUU M.A. Islamic Studies programme is minimum 2 years and maximum 4 years. The students can complete the course in maximum 4 years. Hence, if a student fails to complete the course in 2 years for any reasons, she/he can complete the same in the prescribed maximum duration.

➤ Is there any Difference between MANUU Regular M.A. Islamic Studies and MANUU Distance M.A. Islamic Studies?

No, there is no difference. The programmes offered in regular and distance modes are both equal.
