**MANUU to Impart technical skills to school students
Signs MoU with Vista School**

Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Vista School, Gachibowli to provide technical skills and exchange of learners soft skills in consonance with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 guidelines.
