IT enabled services revolutionized our lives - Prof. D. N. Reddy Refresher Course in CS&IT begins at MANUU

'Whether shopping in supermarkets or ordering food from cloud kitchens, IT enabled services have revolutionized our lives. When I was in IIT Madras in the early 1980s, computers were bulky and cumbersome like refrigerators. Not anymore', said Prof. D. N. Reddy, former Vice Chancellor, Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University (JNTU), Hyderabad at the inaugural of a two weeks long Refresher Programme held today.

The UGC-Human Resources Development Centre (HRDC) at Maulana Azad National University is organizing the Refresher Programme in Computer Science and Information Technology (CS&IT) which will conclude on August 3.

In his inaugural address, the veteran professor who now serves on the recruitment board of the DRDO said, 'Indians are sought after the world over because of their skills in mathematics, knowledge of English and quick adaptability. Success in computer programming requires logical reasoning and while the hardwares have been much more steady, there are new softwares almost everyday. Therefore faculty and students must keep abreast of the rapidly changing technologies' he remarked..

Prof. Syed Imtiaz Hassan, Head, Department of CS&IT, MANUU said 'As technologists we must decide how technology can sustain development'. 'Care has been taken to include topics such as artificial intelligence, machine learning, block chain in the course', said Prof. Tahseen Bilgrami, Director, UGC-HRDC, MANUU.
