Internship Report (2024-2025)

1. Introduction

The Mandatory Internship Programme forms an essential component of the clinical legal education prescribed by the Bar Council of India (BCI) Rules of Legal Education, 2008. MANUU Law School strongly believes that experiential learning through internships enhances students' understanding of law and its functioning in real life.

The BCI Rules (2008), particularly Rule 25(Schedule III) and Schedule II Paper 24 (Moot Court Exercise and Internship), mandate that every law student must undergo a minimum of twelve weeks in case of LL.B program and twenty weeks in case of B.A., LL.B integrated program of internship during the entire course of study, under legal practitioners, law firms, courts, corporate bodies, legal aid organizations, or government offices. MANUU Law School fully adheres to these requirements and regularly monitors the internship placements, supervision, and evaluation process to ensure strict compliance.

The internship program aims to bridge the gap between classroom learning and practical exposure, equipping students with professional skills, ethical awareness, and a realistic understanding of the justice delivery system.

2. Duration and Framework

The internship period for the academic year 2024-2025 was organized during the summer vacation (May-July 2025). Students were placed in District Courts, High Courts, Law Firms, NGOs, Legal Aid Institutions, and Corporate Legal Departments across different states of India.

The duration ranged from two weeks to 8 weeks, depending on the host organization's structure. Each student maintained an Internship Diary and obtained a Completion Certificate duly signed by the supervising advocate or organization head.

3. Objectives of the Internship Program

The key objectives of the internship program are:

- To expose students to the real-time functioning of courts, tribunals, and law firms.
- To develop drafting, research, and communication skills.
- To train students in professional ethics and office discipline.

- To make them familiar with case management, client interaction, and legal documentation.
- To cultivate analytical ability and a sense of responsibility as future lawyers.

5. Nature of Work and Learning Outcomes

- Participated in legal aid and awareness activities organized by NGOs and DLSAs.

These experiences strengthened their practical understanding of the legal system, improved their communication skills, and fostered professionalism.

Such consistent appreciation reflects MANUU Law School's emphasis on quality legal training and ethical practice.

7. Compliance with Bar Council of India Rules

The Law School strictly follows Rule 25 (Schedule III) of the *Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education (2008)*, which provides:

Minimum Period of Internship: (a) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 12 weeks internship for Three Year Course stream and 20 weeks in case of Five Year Course stream during the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, Other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies, Local Self Government and other such bodies as the University shall stipulate, where law is practiced either in action or in dispute resolution or in management. Provided that internship in any year cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and all students shall at least gone through once in the entire academic period with Trial and Appellate Advocates. (b) Each student shall keep Internship diary in such form as may be stipulated by the University concerned and the same shall be evaluated by the Guide in Internship and also a Core Faculty member of the staff each time. The total mark shall be assessed in the Final Semester of the course in the 4th Clinical course as stipulated under the Rules in Schedule II.

MANUU Law School ensures compliance by:

- Maintaining institutional records of all internships and certificates.
- Evaluating student performance through Internship Diaries and Viva Voce.
- Encouraging internships in diverse sectors such as courts, firms, NGOs, and corporates.
- Reporting internship activities during BCI inspection and university audits.

This commitment to regulatory standards demonstrates the School's dedication to producing professionally trained, ethically grounded, and socially responsible lawyers.

8. Institutional Vision

MANUU Law School strives to integrate practical legal education with academic excellence. The institution envisions a holistic legal education that combines doctrinal learning, skill-based training, and social responsibility.


Future initiatives include:

9. Conclusion


