




A meeting of the Board of Studies of the Department of Social Work was held on 06.08.2024 at 1:00 p.m. The following members were present in the meeting.

Prof. Ashok Kumar Mishra and Prof. Vanilla Bhaskaran could not attend the meeting. Prof. Mohd. Shahid, Head, Department of Social Work and Chairperson, BOS, welcome all the members in the meeting. The following agenda items were discussed and approved.

- 1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the BOS:** The Minutes of the BOS meeting held on 06.08.2022 were confirmed.
- 2. Confirmation of the Minutes of the DRCs:** The minutes of the Departmental Research Committee (DRC) meetings held on 29.12.2022, 14.02.2023, 15.03.2023, 12.07.2023, 06.12.2023 & 11.07.2024 were confirmed.
- 3. Approval of Panel of Subject Experts (update):** The updated list of Subject Experts was discussed and approved (Confidential). The confidential list shall be submitted to the Registrar, MANUU.
- 4. Approval of Panel of Examiners for PhD Thesis Evaluation (update):** The updated list of Examiners for PhD Evaluation was discussed and approved (Confidential). The confidential list shall be submitted to the Controller of Examination, MANUU.
- 5. Exploring possibilities for the Four Year Under Graduate Programme (4YUG) in Social Work:** The members deliberated intensively on the possibility of introducing Four Year Under Graduate Programme in Social Work in MANUU. The members reflected on the experiences of running Master of Social Work (MSW) program by the Department of Social Work, MANUU. It came up that over the years, the numbers of applications for MSW have relatively declined. Furthermore, there is a sharp fall in the retention rate of

the students. It was noticed that despite filling all the seats, there is a dropout of around 40% and one of the major reasons is non -availability of hostel accommodation. Further majority of these students are coming from Uttar Pradesh & Bihar and subsequently they got jobs in development sector, national and international organisations mainly located in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.

The house unanimously resolved the following:

1. That the viability of Four Year Under Graduate Programme in Social Work is quiet high if it is introduced in the MANUU Darbhanga Campus, Bihar.
2. That there is a high level of opportunities in field level jobs in Bihar and this could also be helpful for running the course and seeking support from development organisation for Field Exposure, Concurrent Field Work , Block Placement / Internship and subsequent absorption in the job Market.
3. That given the MSW experiences, it would not be possible to retain students for Four Year under Graduate Programme on account of high cost of living in the city (Hyderabad), limited hostel availability coupled with poor socio-economic background of the prospective students.
4. That there has been always negligible response for the MSW Programme from the students from Hyderabad city and neighbouring areas and hence the same may be the response to UG Programme in Social Work in Hyderabad.

The house strongly recommended that the University authorities may be impressed upon to start **Four Year Under Graduate Programme in Social Work (4YUG) along with other forthcoming UG Programme in Darbhanga Campus.** The Social Work subject could be offered as Single Major or Dual Major as per the University Policy.

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

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



##### About the theme

Understand gender constructions and identify gender based discrimination

##### Steps

**Step-1:** Greet the participants (Px) with smile and humble gesture. This will bring them at ease and in a comfortable state of being. State the objectives of the activity.

**Step-2:** Explain to the participants that they need to undertake activity called Agree-Disagree (Gender Sensitivity). Tell them that the purpose of this activity is to help the Px to rethink on the commonly used gender centric statements/remarks and take position on whether you agree or disagree with the said statements (the statements will be read by the facilitator during the activity) and the reasons thereof. It is expected that through this activity the Px will be able to understand that the notion of gender and our understanding of gender is social constructed/ construed. And the many of commonly used remarks/phrases/ statements relating to women reflect the dominant (read male dominant) view of the society (patriarchy) and accordingly these are discriminatory in nature. Such remarks/phrases/ statements reflect the male bias against females (the Other). Therefore it is expected that Px will develop an understanding of the process of Othering in general and gender based othering in particular and the importance of gender sensitivity.

**Step-3:** Tell Px that the facilitator will read statements and in case of each statement they have to take a position in terms of Agree and Disagree and accordingly they are to move into those corners of the room. In case of neutrality/neutral approach on any statement they can stand in between. The possible statements could be:

- Education of boys is more important than girls. Male runs the family.
- Women are divorced for not given birth to male child. Woman is responsible for the birth of male or female child.
- Female dress/postures also have role in the cases of sexual harassment
- Culture of working women is spoiling the family
- Women empowerment is against the natural societal balance

**Step-4:** Facilitator to ignite the discussion on the different positions taken by the students and facilitate arguments and counter arguments. The purpose is let the students ventilate out the rigid social common sense.

**Step-5:** Facilitator to reflect and comment on the activity in terms of its objectives, expected outcomes and overall participation and learning of the Px.

**Step-6:** Facilitator to conclude the session by explaining the importance of sensitivity to gender. Thanks and greetings to Px.

Announce the details of next session: schedule and any prior preparation/task they need to do for the next session.
