I. Introduction

The UGC has approved the Maulana Azad National Urdu University as one of the universities to set up a Centre for the Study of Social Inclusion (CSSI) to study the nature, extent and forms of social exclusion among some selective socially excluded groups at present and to suggest theoretical and policy formulations in this regard. The main thrust area of this Centre is to study religious minorities with specific focus upon the Muslims as a socially excluded group, exclusion of Urdu speaking population, while studying the other excluded groups such as dalits and tribes communities. It also plays a key role in suggesting policy formulations aiming at eradicating the problem of social exclusion and discrimination and protecting the rights of these groups. Its' activities include, teaching, research and action oriented programmes in collaboration with the reputed bodies and institutions working in the areas of social development among the socially excluded groups. WORKSHOP

One Day National Workshop on “Transition in Tribal Societies: Evaluating Inclusive Policies and Outcomes” (November 6, 2024)

A Brief Report

Tribal communities in India have traditionally lived in relative isolation from the broader society, often in remote or hilly areas. Historically, they have faced marginalization and exclusion, with limited access to resources, education and political representation. The colonial period and post-independence developments have both played roles in shaping their current status. The workshop was conducted with the following objectives: Enhance understanding of tribal cultures, traditions and their experiences; Discuss challenges faced by tribal communities and breaking stereotypes; Tribal Rights and Constitutional Provisions and Explore strategies for empowerment, inclusivity and building bridges

In the Inaugural Session, Dr. V. Samujwala, (Director, Tribal Cultural Research & Training Institute, Govt. of Telangana) addressed the participants on ‘Tribal Situation in Telangana State’ and narrated the various problems the tribal communities are encountering in the contemporary period and how to bring them in the mainstream development. Through field experiences, she said how the TCR&TI has been facilitating the tribal communities for their inclusive growth. In his Keynote, Prof. N. Sudhakar Rao (Retd. Professor of Anthropology, University of Hyderabad) presented the idea of an Inclusive Community Approach to Tribal Development, which complements the existing strategies. This approach aims for the positive transition of tribal communities in the country.

Topics Covered by the Resource Persons

Prof. Ajailiu Niumai, CSSI, HCU, talked on ‘Political Representation and Gender in the Tribal Community in Northeast India’. After her deliberation another speaker Prof. B. Bhangya Department of History, University of Hyderabad presented on ‘Development and Democracy in Adivasi India’. Prof. P.H. Mohammad, Department of Sociology, MANUU, presented on ‘Accelerated Globalisation and Tribal Integration in India: An Intersection of Cultural Adaptation and Economic Transition’. Another speaker Dr. T. Appa Rao. Department of Anthropology, HCU, talked on ‘The PESA Act and Tribal Empowerment: A Perspective’ the third speaker Dr. Vijaya Ramdas, Department of History, HCU, presented on ‘Exploring the Adivasi Communities in Central and South- eastern India: Forest Lifestyles, Cultural Preservatives and Social Transformation’ and the last speaker Dr. Bibekananda, Department of Sociology, MANUU presented on ‘Tribal Ashram School Education System in Odisha: Issues of Inclusion and Challenges’.

The participants of the Workshop expressed their happiness which provided them the opportunity to learn the various aspects of understanding tribal cultures, traditions, challenges faced by tribal communities, breaking stereotypes, tribal rights & constitutional provisions, exploring the strategies for empowerment and inclusion.

Outcome

The Workshop emphasized the foremost need for equitable quality education, involving the community to ensure social inclusion, aligning with SDG No.4. It discussed ways to implement various government policies in tribal areas, focusing on the peculiar needs of STs and bridging the gap in policy making and programs' implementation for inclusive growth. The Workshop highlighted the importance of continuous policy refinement and inclusive development strategies for long-term improvements in tribal communities.

Sensitization Programme - Under Viksit Bharat@2047

“Enhancing Awareness of Government Schemes Among Women Housekeeping and Other Staff in MANUU, Hyderabad: A Path to Empowerment and Equity” held on 23.01.2025

Centre for the Study of Social Inclusion has organized a Sensitization Programme under Viksit Bharat@2047 on “*Enhancing Awareness of Government Schemes Among Women Housekeeping and Other Staff in MANUU, Hyderabad: A Path to Empowerment and Equity*” on 23rd January, 2025. The program chaired by Prof. Sk.Ishtiaque Ahmed, the Registrar of MANUU. Prof. Danish Moin introduced the theme of the program and explained the importance of sensitization programmes meant for marginalized communities which will enhance their skills in utilising the varied government schemes and programmes for their growth.

Dr. Swarupa Rani, Guest Faculty, CSSI, MANUU, explained the various state government schemes which are useful for the women. She highlighted that we must align our aspirations and our efforts to ensure that the 21st century, destined to be the century of Bharat, and make 'Viksit Bharat' in this century and advance towards fulfilling those dreams. Dr. Ayesha Uzma, Assistant Professor, CSSI, MANUU presented on the central government schemes related to the women. She expressed that the women and education are the two wheels of the chariot that will drive the nation towards 'Viksit Bharat' “We cannot dream of a Viksit Bharat without women and without education. Dr. Mohd Kareem, CSSI, MANUU, made a presentation of the government initiatives for the development of Bharat by 2047. He said that the Viksit Bharat mainly focuses on Yuva (Youth), Garib (Poor), Mahila (Women) and Kisan (Farmers). Viksit Bharat's initiative for promoting gender equity and economic empowerment that would help women (particularly working in the domain of housekeeping and other domestic works); he explained about various available resources and government schemes which enhance their socio-economic situation and contribute towards a more inclusive society. The programme ended with Question and Answer session with participants and resource persons about clarifications of various schemes presented in the programme. Participants expressed their satisfaction and requested to organize similar programmes in urban slums and rural areas, where poor and marginlised women get more awareness on these schemes.

Two-Day National Seminar on “Breaking the Silence: Addressing Gender Based Violence in India” during February 5-6, 2025

Centre for the Study of Social Inclusion (CSSI) organized a two-day National Seminar titled "Breaking the Silence: Addressing Gender-Based Violence in India" on February 5–6, 2025. The seminar aimed to engage scholars, activists and practitioners in a critical dialogue on the multidimensional aspects of gender-based violence and social exclusion in India.

Prof. Danish Moin (Director, CSSI) provided an overview of the seminar’s objectives, emphasizing the need to amplify marginalized voices and address structural inequalities. The keynote speaker, Prof. Sarasu Esther Thomas (Manipal Law School) emphasized on the legal, structural and cultural dimensions of GBV and the urgent need for intersectional reform. The Chief Guest, Mr. Kartikeya Sharma (IPS), provided insights into law enforcement perspectives on gender violence and community-based prevention. A panel discussion was held on the theme *"Unheard No More: Confronting Gender-Based Violence in India"*, featuring eminent voices from academia and civil society. This was followed by two technical sessions focusing on *"Rethinking Sex and Gender"* and *"Empowerment Through Inclusionary Measures"*.

The second day began with a panel discussion titled *"Unpacking the Intersectionality's: How Gender-Based Violence Affects Marginalized Communities"*, followed by two technical sessions on *"Gender Development and Gender Inclusion"* and *"Gender and Inclusive Governance"*. Valedictory address given by Prof. Shruti Tambe (Savitribai Phule Pune University), who emphasized the importance of sustained research and advocacy in shaping inclusive and gender-sensitive policies. More than 20 research papers were presented on both the days, addressing issues ranging from incarceration, religious and gender norms, LGBTQ+ marginalization, human trafficking to financial inclusion and workplace harassment.

Outcomes

The Seminar has provided the information that GBV in India has had severe and long-lasting consequences for its victims, affecting not only individuals but also families, communities and society as a whole. It is discussed that the outcomes can be physical, emotional or psychological, leading to physical health issues, mental health concerns, social consequences, economic impact and societal implications. The main outcomes of discussions and deliberations of the Seminar are:

- Scholarly discourse on gender violence, intersectionality and social exclusion.
- The need for effective support systems (like counselling services, rehabilitation programmes), community awareness, policy reforms and healthcare and law enforcement is stressed upon.
- Addressing GBV in India requires a multi-faceted approach, involving government, communities and individuals working together to create a safer and more equitable society.
- The Seminar has a participation of over 50 academicians and researchers from

leading universities and institutions across India and it has created a platform for policy recommendations and interdisciplinary collaboration.

This seminar not only enriched academic discourse but also aligned with MANUU's commitment to fostering inclusive and socially responsive education and research.

V. Academic Outreach Programs

CSSI imparts and disseminates its research findings to a wider audience, including other Centres working on the social exclusion issues, general academia, researchers, civil society organisations, NGOs, political leaders, policy makers, international organisations, etc., through extension lectures, workshops, seminars and collaborating action programs. The Centre also works at grass root levels and also at the level of policy making. The Centre's team has made visits to the ministries/departments of Social Welfare, Tribal Welfare and Minority Welfare, of Government of Telangana, to have interactive sessions with their officials to bring their policies and programmes to be effectively implemented for the target population. The Centre's Research Team makes frequent visits to the villages and urban neighborhoods on periodical basis for interaction with the village residents, panchayat/local officials, ward members, corporators, elected representatives, pavement/slum-dwellers, marginalized communities and people with gender issues.

Outreach Programme-I (Old Age-cum-Orphanage Home Visit)

As a part of Centre's outreach programs, the research team of the Centre visited an old-age cum orphanage home in Hyderabad city to understand the issues related to old-age people/children living in there and the maintenance of charity homes. Studying old age-related issues is crucial for several reasons such as demographic shift (population is aging, with increasing number of older adults). It is thought that the understanding their needs and challenges is essential for planning and providing adequate support. In addition, understanding old age-related issues informs policy decisions on healthcare, social isolation, social security, housing and other areas affecting older adults. Studying these issues help develop effective strategies for support systems. Keeping these issues in consideration, the team of the Centre under the title "A Study on Old Age and Orphanage Home in Hyderabad" has visited "Hyderabad Zilla Mahila Mandalula Samakhya" Old Age and Orphanage Home at Kukatpally, a typical middle class sub-urban neighbourhood of Hyderabad city, on August 14, 2024.

The visit aimed to gain insights into the living conditions and emotional well-being of elderly and orphaned residents. Many older individuals wish to spend their later years surrounded by family, a desire that deserves understanding and respect from younger generations. Ageing should not lead to isolation or neglect; rather, it marks a meaningful stage of life that calls for dignity and care. This visit was an opportunity to understand the problems related to old-age home residents, foster empathy, raise awareness about the challenges faced by the elderly, and offer emotional support

through direct interaction. By spending time with the residents, the visit helped understand both the positive and negative issues related to financial, emotional and administrative/state support in the form of schemes related to them. It also highlighted the need to create a compassionate and inclusive society where individuals of all ages are acknowledged, valued, and treated with dignity and care.

Outcomes:

- To address these issues, it has become clear that it is essential to have a multi-faceted approach that involves government initiatives, community support and awareness generation.
- Interactions made the management of old age home about government initiatives / programs such as Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana and Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana provide financial assistance, healthcare support and social integration strategies for seniors; even the organisers of old-age homes are not aware of existing schemes for senior citizens.
- Incorporating senior friendly infrastructure and accessible housing solutions both by private and government/charity homes in urban planning can improve the quality of life for elderly individuals.
- Strengthening legal frameworks and protective services can help prevent elder abuse and neglect.

Outreach Programme – II (Aloor Village)

As part of Outreach Programme, the Centre has made the village adaption programme at Aloor Village in Rangareddy District of Telangana State. The Centre’s research team visited Aloor Village on February 18, 2025 for orientation/sensitization for panchayat/local officials and elected representatives, as well as the village residents and different religious representatives/leaders of the local communities. The large number of residents and representatives participated/attended in the sensitization /awareness programme of various Central and Telangana government schemes, held at the Gram Panchayat office of Aloor village. The village residents showed much interest in getting the information from various government schemes which were not heard of much at village level. The Centre’s team, lead by its Director, held interactive sessions on ‘Various Government Schemes’ and explained different central and Telangana government schemes being implemented for inclusive growth. The Team tried to sensitize the community leaders and common people to bring back them into the mainstream and tried to know the awareness levels on different schemes being implemented by the governments. It was observed that the level of knowledge of these schemes are little known in the village residents. The Team prepared a list of various government schemes and handed handover it to the community representatives and requested them to utilize the government schemes.

Outreach Program in Aloor Village, Chevella Mandal, Ranga Reddy District

The team of the CSSI has conducted a One Day Sensitization Program on February 18, 2025 at Gram Panchayat building, Aloor village and interacted with Yuva (Youth), Garib (Poor), Mahila (Women) and Kisan (Farmers).

Some of the important activities undertaken by the Faculty Members of CSSI are given below.

The program was designed with structured activities and clearly defined objectives. It aligned with the broader commitment of the State towards formulating a National Charter aimed at ensuring social justice for deprived communities, including Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Minorities.

Recognizing the significance of this mission, particularly keeping in mind of Viksit Bharat programme, the Centre focused on engaging with Youth (Yuva), Women (Mahila), Farmers (Kisan), and the Economically Disadvantaged (Garib). The aim was to raise awareness of various government welfare schemes, deepen understanding of their socio-economic realities, and promote inclusive development.

By interacting directly with residents, Panchayat officials, ward members and elected representatives, the program sought to understand grassroots challenges, share lived experiences and discuss actionable strategies for policy inclusion ultimately contributing to the upliftment and integration of marginalized communities into the mainstream.

Outcome:

- Creation of more awareness about various central and state governments schemes / programmes
- Active participation of rural youth, women and community elders
- Boosting of confidence levels of participants in initiating negotiations with government officials to avail the appropriate schemes

VI. Monthly Lecture / Distinguished Lecture Series

Lecture Series Program

The Centre has initiated a Popular Lecture Series Program (PLSP) and the Monthly Lecture Series Program (MLSP) under which well-known personalities of research and administration and the civil society networks are invited to deliver lectures on the topics covering the social exclusion. The objective of these programs is to sensitize the campus community/civil society on the social exclusion issues and to evolve a debate on the particular subject seeking further research interest and policy support concerning the issue. The speakers invited are from different places in the country and also from the international bodies. The Centre and its faculty also share their thoughts over the issues so to understand the commonalities involved in the issues across India and other countries. Also, the Centre has its own forum of debate within the Centre faculty members who often sit the round table to discuss and share the ideas about the issues of social exclusion and various inclusive policies.
