Introduction to Button Masala:

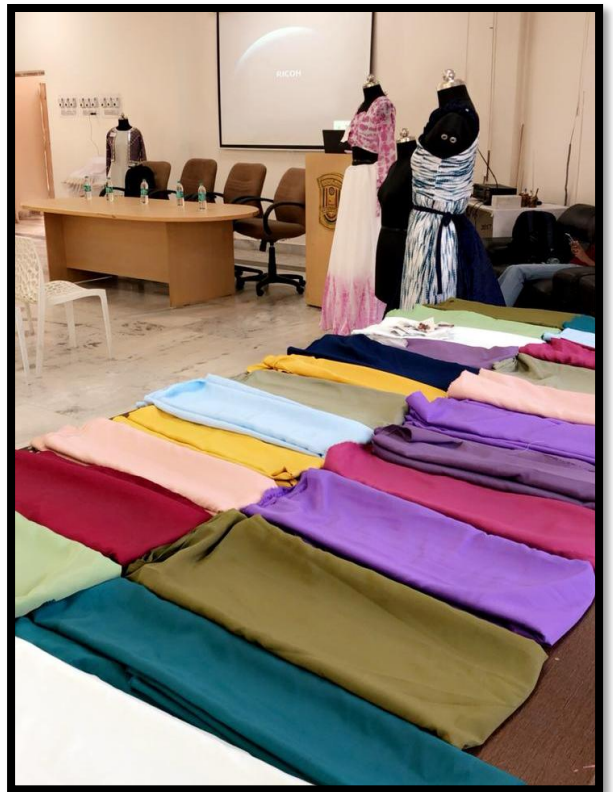
1. Understanding the history and cultural relevance of button art.
