ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

This "repository of knowledge", as Bhartrihari said, allows societies to function and evolve. Early 20th-century thinkers explored language's role in shaping reality. They argued that language isn't just a reflection of thought, but its very foundation. This "linguistic turn" fostered interdisciplinary research, creating new knowledge at the intersection of various fields. Efforts to revitalise lesser-known languages recognize the link between language, land, and knowledge. This empowers communities to reclaim their identities and histories.

India's rich variety of languages and cultures highlights the importance of multilingualism. This diversity necessitates understanding lesser-known cultures and fostering inclusive education policies that value primary languages. Migration both enriches and dilutes linguistic diversity. Policies are crucial to support language preservation in changing demographics. Language sustainability requires a supportive sociocultural ecosystem. Technology plays a transformative role in language education, translation, raising awareness of diverse cultures, and language preservation. Artificial intelligence offers new tools for language learning and documentation of less-common languages.

This conference aims to bring together scholars, policymakers, and community activists to explore contemporary issues in language. It seeks to address language preservation, sustainability, mobility, technology's impact, and the intersection of language, literature, culture, and societal impact.

The best papers will be published in edited volume(s) with Springer Nature. The publication will remain subject to positive peer review due diligence.
