

## **Publication Ethics Guidelines**

### **Originality & Authorship**

- The work presented must be original and not plagiarized
- All authors listed must have contributed significantly to the research.
- Ghost, guest, or honorary authorship is unethical

### **Prior Publication & Dual Submission**

- The work should not have been published previously in the same form

### **Proper Attribution & Plagiarism**

- Cite all sources, data, and prior work accurately

### **Plagiarism**

- Plagiarism should be avoided. Acceptable limit of plagiarism is 10%. Please provide plagiarism certificate with the submitted abstract/manuscript

### **Data Integrity & Reproducibility**

- Data must be accurate, not fabricated, or manipulated.
- Be prepared to share methodology and raw data if requested

### **Conflict of Interest (COI) Disclosure**

- Disclose any financial, institutional, or personal conflicts that may influence the research.
- Funding sources must be acknowledged in the presentation

### **Ethical Approval & Compliance**

- Research involving human/animal subjects must have proper ethical approval (if applicable).

### **Copyright & Permissions**

- If using copyrighted material (images, figures), obtain necessary permissions

### **Prohibition of AI-Generated Content**

- The research and presentation content (including text, data, and visuals) must be the original work of the authors and not generated by artificial intelligence (AI) tools without proper human oversight
- If AI-assisted tools (e.g., for language editing, data analysis, or image generation) are used, they must be explicitly disclosed, and their role should not compromise the authenticity and intellectual contribution of the authors
- Fabricated or fully AI-generated submissions (where human authors did not conduct the actual research) are considered unethical and may lead to rejection or retraction

### **Accurate Citation**

- All sources used in the work must be accurately cited, ensuring proper attribution to the original authors

**Duplicate Publication:**

- Authors should not publish the same or substantially similar work in multiple publications

**Informed Consent:**

- If the research involves human subjects, authors must obtain informed consent from participants
