As an embodiment of culture, language comprises the existential universe of a people. It shapes our experiences of the world and has led to the resurgence of the view that language plays a significant role in the creation and circulation of concepts. The resurgence rekindled the importance of the study of language and made it a significant area of inquiry for all disciplines of intellectual investigation. One can look at the history of the world through the lens of language and understand the dynamics of the clash and conflation of cultures, of migrations and assimilations. The history of languages tells us more about evolution, dispersal and decline of civilizations than any other tool of history or archeology.

The strength of Arabic, Persian and Urdu lie in their civilizational consilience intellectually manifested through the emergence of studies surrounding 'Arabicate' (Ricci, 2011), 'Persianate' (Hodgson, 1974) and 'Urdusphere' (Green 2011). They share centuries-old historical bonds that developed across interconnected Islamic as well non-Islamic cultural contexts, stretching from the Arabian Peninsula through Iran to the Indian subcontinent. These ties are reflected in linguistic, literary, and intellectual exchanges that have produced a rich and shared legacy.

These three languages have enriched each other through vocabulary, poetic forms, rhetoric, Sufi philosophy, literary criticism, and a vibrant tradition of multilingual authorship. Yet, each has retained its distinctive identity and cultural depth.

This conference is an attempt to reflect on some aspects – social, cultural, literary, cultural, translation, intertextuality, social and political – of this phenomenon at multiple levels, ranging from pronunciation patterns to words that represent the very soul of a community.

This international academic conference seeks to explore these multifaceted relations, deepen comparative understanding, and expand scholarly engagement in the fields of Eastern languages and literatures.
