### II. Work Plan of HKSCDS related to Bharatiya Basha Samiti

The Government of India under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has constituted Bharatiya Basha Samithi (BBS) to cater to the demand of the students who wish to study in their mother tongue. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of MANUU has been appointed as Nodal Officer for the writing of reference books in Urdu language across disciplines.

### VI. U.S. Fulbright Nehru Scholar getting attached to HKSCDS

Dr. Asif Majid, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Dramatic Arts, University of Connecticut, Storrs, CT has been provided affiliation with the H.K. Sherwani Centre for Deccan Studies, MANUU by United States India Educational Foundation (USIEF) as a U.S. Fulbright-Nehru Senior Scholar Research (Flex) Grant in two phases. The title of his research project is "*Performing Muharram in Plurality: Art, Bodies and Commemoration in Lucknow and Hyderabad*". The faculty member nominated as coordinator for the scholar is Prof. Salma Ahmed Farooqui. He will be arriving in Hyderabad in July 2024.

### VII. Claim of final instalment from U.S. Consulate General Hyderabad

The H.K. Sherwani Centre for Deccan Studies had received a total grant of \$ 7224.07 from the U.S. Consulate General Hyderabad and an American philanthropist towards the shipment of Omar Khalidi books and holding of one-day conference.

From the above amount, the share of the US Consulate is \$ 4518.93 out of which \$ 4,000 has been given to MANUU in MANUU's IOB A/C No. 01. This amount has already been settled by the Finance Section of MANUU. Now, the remaining amount of \$ 518.93 has been claimed through proper channel of Finance Officer, MANUU. The said amount will be credited in MANUU's IOB A/C No. 01 in the next few weeks. The Centre will utilize this amount for digitization of books (205 books have been already identified) which is part of the MoU.

### IX. Introduction of Generic Paper on "Reading Medieval Manuscripts"

The H.K. Sherwani Centre for Deccan Studies intends to introduce a Generic Paper of **4 Credits** titled "**Reading Medieval Manuscripts**" from the academic year 2024-25 in the Even Semester for PG students of MANUU.
